A death can be registered by the Embassy of Sri Lanka under the section 7 of the Consular Functions Act, if deceased is a citizen of Sri Lanka (should hold a valid resident permit at the time of death or should be a dual citizen) and the death occurred in a country of accreditation (France, Spain, Portugal, Monaco and Andorra)

01. Who can apply for the registration of death?

- The nearest relative of the deceased, who was present at the time of death/the person who was with the deceased when he/she was finally alive.
- A relative of the deceased who resides in the country where the death has been occurred
- If there is no such relative, any other person who was present at the time of death
- The main occupant of the residence where the death has been occurred
- The doctor in charge of the hospital or public institution where the death has been occurred.
- If there are no such persons, the person who takes the actions to dispose the human remains of the deceased by burial cremation or by any other means.
